The Neurodevelopmental Research Lab (NRL) at Case Western Reserve University is seeking children & adults with an autism spectrum disorder (7-30 years of age) to participate in research regarding social and communication functioning. Participants will complete autism-specific assessments (e.g., the Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule-ADOS) and receive a speech-language evaluation. Participation involves a scheduled visit to the NRL on the CASE campus in Cleveland, Ohio. Some portions of testing can take place in the individual's home.

Why should you participate in this research?

- Participants receive a written report on cognitive, speech, and behavioral assessments conducted as part of the research. This information may help educational planning and vocational training. Participants will receive an honorarium to help defray the costs incurred for time and travel.
- By taking part you will be helping us learn more about the characteristics of autism spectrum disorders and Prader-Willi syndrome. Our research is based upon the belief that we can improve treatments when we have a better understanding of the symptoms of these disorders.
